Cricket Sixes to be bigger than ever

KARON: The surging interest in cricket on the island will reach its zenith between April 12 and 16 with the third Phuket International Cricket Sixes tournament, to be played for the third year at Karon Stadium.

The tournament has expanded hugely. This year 28 teams are expected to play, compared with 18 last year and 10 in 2004, the event's inaugural year.

The teams set to play will again demonstrate the popularity of the game, which, arguably, comes joint second with rugby behind soccer as the world's most popular team game.

Twenty-four of the teams will fly into Phuket from the UK,

Australia, Singapore, Bahrain, India, Pakistan, Taiwan, Macau, mainland China, Hong Kong and Malaysia – with the remainder coming from Thailand, including local Phuket teams.

Michael "Cat" Maher, Chairman of the Asian Cricket Sixes Tour, noted, "Cricket is one of the highest-profile sports in the world, and the Phuket International Cricket Sixes really showcases the island to millions of cricket lovers across the globe as a wonderful destination."

Tournament Director Brad Tarr said, "We're delighted that in only the third year of the tournament, we're expecting 28 teams to compete at this year's Phuket Sixes," adding, "The response has been tremendous." Event Director Poonpun 'Nui' Jangrugsa of The Green Man said, "The Phuket Sixes is growing ever more popular and we are looking forward to welcoming a record number of [players] to Phuket this year."

Spectators will be welcome to come and enjoy this year's tournament, which will include a number of nighttime matches. Hours of play will be from 2 pm to 6 pm on the opening day of the tournament while play will be between 10 am and 10 pm on the remaining days. Entry is free.

Boonsak dominates badminton tourney

SAPHAN HIN: Chiang Mai native Boonsak Polsana won the men's singles in the first round of the Master Thailand Badminton Professional 2006 series held at the Saphan Hin Sports Complex from February 23 to 26.

K. Boonsak, 24, also paired up with his sister Salakjit to take the mixed doubles.

Phuket was the venue for the first round of the competition, organized jointly by the Badminton Association of Thailand and Sports Authority of Thailand to "discover" the best badminton players in the country, region by region.

Three more venues are slated to host the talent search: Khon Kaen (March 16-19), Rayong (May 18-21) and Chiang Mai (July 13-16). The final round will be held in Bangkok in September.

Boonsak, currently ranked 15th in the world, told the *Gazette* that the match had gone better than he expected.

Maybe, he said, his opponent in the final, Chaipong Laemkhaothong, had played too much the previous day and, as a result, was tired.

As to the champion's background, he explained, "I started to play badminton when I was nine years old and come from a sporting family. My parents support and encourage us. If things go on like I hope they will, I hope to break into the top 10 in the world this year.

"I would like to see badminton better known and for more people to take part in the sport, both professionally and in amateur circles.

"As for me, I have a week in which to relax and then I'm playing in the Chinese Masters in Chendu. This year I have about 20 tournaments lined up. One thing I can say about Phuket is that it's very hot here."
